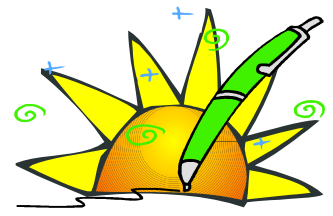

Topics Covered

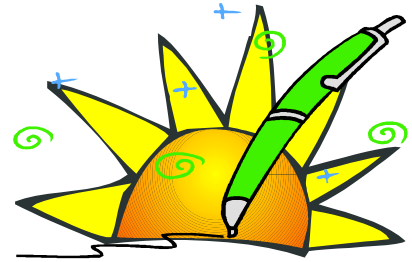
- Engaging and practical strategies for teaching writing that you can begin on Day 1
